17 - Smoking Policy

Introduction

This policy has been devised in consultation with staff and committee members of Sticky Finger's Pre-school, with reference from the Smokefree Somerset and Smoke Free Somerset Alliance.

Rationale

- Research shows that although rates are falling, around 5% of young people are regular smokers by the age of 15.
- Almost all adults took up the habit when they were children.
- There were 74,600 deaths attributable to smoking in England in 2019.
- People are harmed by second hand smoke, e.g. lung cancer and childhood respiratory disease, heart disease, cot death, middle ear disease and asthmatic attacks in children.
- E-cigarettes are a relatively new product – they aren't risk free and their long-term impact is not known.
- Schools have a role to play in working towards a smoke free society. All young children need to be protected and given clear messages about the dangers of smoking.

Aims

- This Pre School aims to be a health promoting organisation.
- This Pre School aims to protect staff, young children and visitors from the effects of tobacco smoke.
- This Pre School will comply with the new Health Act (2006) which bans smoking in all workplace and enclosed public areas.

Content

- Smoking is not allowed anywhere on the premises, buildings or grounds (including exits to the sites). This also applies to E-cigarettes and vapes.
- This applies to all staff, parents, visitors and contractors.

Communicating the policy to staff parents/carers and visitors

- Staff will be informed at recruitment of the No Smoking Policy.
- Clearly worded signs will be sited to visually alert and inform both members of the public and staff.
- Information will be provided in the Pre School prospectus and website.

- Details on stop smoking services will be available to all through leaflets, posters, and www.smokefreesomerset.nhs.uk

Monitoring and evaluation.

- This policy is available to review on request.
- The monitoring will be carried out through an annual review involving Staff, Committee and Parents. Ultimate responsibility for the implementation of this policy rests with the Committee.
